

Supply List: Fast Finishes For Odd Shaped Quilts (3hrs)

Have you envisioned creating an exciting quilt with odd shaped perimeters but weren't sure how to finish it? In this class Vikki offers fast and easy alternatives to the traditional binding finish. Students will make samples of each technique to take home.

Before class: Prepare three "quilt sandwiches" about 15"x15" for practice. A sandwich includes a top layer fabric, a layer of stabilizer, batting and a bottom fabric. Quilt the sandwich with a straight machine stitch. You only need to quilt it enough to hold the layers together. Use inexpensive cotton fabric for surface and bottom. Color does not matter.

Additional fabric: Bring some ½-1 yrd cuts for facing, faux binding and envelope backing .

Stabilizer for sandwiches—Three yards of Pellon regular lightweight or mid-weight stabilizer (***not iron-on or tear-away***)

Freezer paper 1 yard

Stitch Witchery (By Dritz) on a roll (5/8")

Needles (for sewing machine) use regular 80/12 for piecing

Scissors- paper and fabric

Flex curve (only if you have one)

Extension cord (and an adapter, if necessary)

Steam iron and ironing mat or board

Spray bottle for water (moistening fabric for pressing)

Straight pins (sharp!)

Fabric marking pencil

Plastic corner or blunt instrument (for smoothing turned seams)

Threads -bring a variety...for matching or blending the fabrics.

Bobbin wound with gray thread

eraser, pencils, ruler, notebook

1. Fast envelope—quick turn
2. Binding-Faced to back
3. Binding-Faced to front
4. Easy miter with topstitching
